Dare County Schools Safe Schools Plan

House Bill 1032 — "The Deborah Greenblatt Act" is an act to clarify the permissible use of seclusion and restraint in public schools and to provide for training in management of student behavior. Dare County Schools is dedicated to implementing and following all the requirements as set forth in this law.

Dare County Schools will ensure that all appropriate personnel are trained in the management of disruptive or dangerous student behavior. This will include instruction in positive management of student behavior, effective communication for defusing and deescalating disruptive or dangerous behavior, and safe and appropriate use of seclusion and restraint. Appropriate school personnel to receive training include, but are not limited to, teachers, teacher assistants, school administrators, bus drivers, school resource officers, school psychologists, and school counselors, with priority for those staff members most likely to be called upon to prevent or address dangerous student behavior. Dare County Schools will also ensure that all lateral entry teachers receive pre-service training in the areas described above, as well as training in the identification and education of children with disabilities.

The effectiveness of this training will be evaluated by a continual review of the documentation and reporting data required for each incident.

Finally, Dare County Schools will follow all procedures as set forth in this law as required for notification, reporting and documentation.
